The Texas Cyberstar Certificate Program is a voluntary program recognizing public and private organizations that meet criteria for cybersecurity best practices. Requirements are selected by the Texas Cybersecurity Council and the Texas Cybersecurity Coordinator.

Why Get a Cyberstar Certificate?

- Demonstrate a commitment to cybersecurity best practices.
- Be recognized within the Texas cybercommunity and published on the DIR website.
- Obtain certificates and logo for advertising and other external communications.

Who is Eligible?

Texas public and private entities who meet the requirements specified in the **Texas Cyberstar Certificate** Program Manual are eligible.

How to Apply:

- 1. Review the requirements in the program manual.
- 2. Submit a certificate request certifying compliance with the requirements and providing requested documentation.

There is no cost to submit a certificate request. Certificates must be renewed biennially.

Notes: The program was established by Texas Government Code Section 2054.5181. A certificate does not validate an organization's overall cybersecurity program or its ability to withstand an attempted cyber breach, hack, attack, etc.

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
